

University of Florida College of Medicine – Jacksonville Chair of Radiology

The University of Florida's College of Medicine – Jacksonville (UF COM-J) invites applications and nominations for the position of Chair, Department of Radiology.

The Radiology Chair will join a strong leadership team that has set its sights on advancing the national profile of UF Health. The population of the area, in conjunction with the strong statewide reputation of UF Health, provides a great opportunity for clinical growth.

The Department of Radiology offers residents of Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia the resources of an academic medical center – UF Health - and a patient-friendly environment. Radiology services are provided at convenient locations across Jacksonville, with imaging available at UF Health Jacksonville, UF Health North, UF Health Emerson Medical Plaza, UF Health Imaging Center-Wildlight, UF Health East and UF Health Imaging Center-Baymeadows.

The department offers graduate medical education training in three ACGME-accredited programs: Diagnostic Radiology Residency, Interventional Radiology-Independent Residency and Interventional Radiology-Integrated Residency. In addition, the department offers non-standard fellowship programs in Breast Imaging and Intervention and Musculoskeletal Imaging. The department also offers a four-week clinical radiology elective/clerkship course for fourth-year medical students. Imaging-based research is incorporated into the training of residents, fellows and faculty.

Reporting to the Dean of the College of Medicine - Jacksonville, the chair is responsible for the overall administrative, academic, and clinical outcomes of the department. UF seeks an accomplished academician and clinician with an MD/DO from an accredited school, current ABR board certification, and have a national reputation for clinical, educational and scholarly activities appropriate for appointment to the rank of Professor or Associate Professor in either a clinical or tenure-track position. Candidates must possess significant leadership experience, such as a section or division chief, vice chair or similar role, with demonstrated fiscal and managerial responsibility. It is important for the new Chair to possess a vision to ensure that the Department grows in rank and reputation. The ideal candidate will be able to grow the department's clinical program in concert with the expansion of UF Health Jacksonville. The candidate should have national recognition and be actively involved in professional societies and physician organizations.

With more than 6,200 faculty and staff, UF Health in Jacksonville is the largest UF campus outside of Gainesville. UF Health physicians offer primary care and specialty services in practices throughout Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia, tallying more than 650,000 outpatient visits and more than 40,000 inpatient admissions annually.

UF Health in Jacksonville, Florida, is comprised of:
