RESIDENT MANUAL

RESIDENT GME COMMITTEE—A GMEC SUBCOMMITTEE

The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) requires that institutions provide a forum for residents to meet and discuss work environment and educational issues.

The Resident Graduate Medical Education Committee (ResGMEC) was created for this purpose.

The ResGMEC consists of one or more representatives from each core and some subspecialty programs and is led by peer-selected colleagues. Leadership positions include: Chair, Vice Chair, two Members-at-Large, Duval County Medical Society representative, and Social Chair(s). Representatives from the Office of Educational Affairs; UF Health Jacksonville administration, nurse management, information technology; and Center for Healthy Minds and Practice (CHaMP) provide reports to the ResGMEC at each of the monthly meetings. In collaboration with the Senior Associate Dean for Educational Affairs, the group meets nine times per year, providing an effective forum for issues to be raised that pertain to the educational and work environment. The Chair and Vice Chairs are voting members of the GMEC, and the Resident GMEC also makes a formal report to the UF Health Jacksonville Medical Executive Committee each month.

Residents and fellows have an opportunity to bring their concerns directly to the ResGMEC leadership during any Resident Townhall meeting, which occurs three times per year. Otherwise, resident representatives may be contacted anytime to share concerns or issues at the next scheduled meeting. In addition, ResGMEC meetings are open to all residents and fellows.
